Did You Know

How To Make This Work (excerpts from The Paper)

Have you ever wondered how we can make this concept of providing hope for the future for those that are homeless and in need in our local community a reality? Does it seem that the issues or difficulties are too daunting?

Camp Hope in Las Cruces, New Mexico has found a way to make it happen. Begun as an experiment in 2011, Nicole Martinez, executive director of the nonprofit Mesilla Valley Community of Hope (MVCH), asked the city for a three-month trial of a small tent camp on city land to give people living on the street a temporary place to stay. The city agreed.

Now, 13 years later, Camp Hope can house up to 50 people in tents. Many tents are in three-walled, roofed shelters that protect them from sun and wind. The camp has restrooms, showers, laundry, kitchen and a community garden. Next door at MVCH, residents have access to a food bank, medical care, case management and a menu of services to help them get back on their feet. The camp does have rules: (no violence, no weapons, must help with maintenance, for example), but it's largely governed by residents, who have helped make the rules. People can keep their pets. They can't use drugs or alcohol on site, but if they return to camp after imbibing elsewhere, they can stay as long as they don't bother others. There is no minimum or maximum stay.

Camp Hope operates on the principle of Housing First, which holds that people can't effectively respond to treatment and help until they're safely housed. Once they have the basics, residents are more open to such services as behavioral health treatment, education and training, or eventually permanent housing.





Some residents aren't ready to move quickly from tent to apartment—they need some transition time to develop trust and self-confidence. Camp Hope allows this transition time, but managers are clear that permanent housing is the ultimate goal. The work is not easy and achieving and sustaining this new normal requires new systems, different decisions, new ideas and a full force of a community demanding it. If you think that homelessness is not an issue, think again. In most instances, you may not "see" it. We must change the way we understand the problem. Most importantly, we must believe that homelessness is solvable. Won't you join us in finding solutions?

PRAYING IN THESE DIVISIVE TIMES

The 2024 political season is in full swing and with it comes even more focus on different opinions and stands, even amongst Christians. In these divisive times even how to pray for our nation can be a subject that lends itself to differing opinions and argument.



While knowing there is no way to write an article on this subject without having some who will disagree, I offer the following biblical recommendations.

First, as we discussed last time, using Jesus' model is always right, and the beginning of the "Lord's Prayer" in Matthew 6 is a good approach:

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be thy name (may we regard your name as Holy). Your kingdom come, YOUR will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

Sometimes we think we know His will, or we assume we do. We hear things or read things that people say. We all have opinions. But people are flawed and vulnerable. Setting our opinions aside is always best when it comes to talking to the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

God says in Isaiah 55:

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

Quoting journalist Billy Hallowell: "Politics and cultural chaos can breed division, but no matter where you stand, as Christians we are called to pray for Kings (our political leaders) and those in authority.

Psalm 22:28 says "For dominion belongs to the Lord and he rules over the nations."

Daniel 2: 20 -21 says Praise be to the name of God for ever and ever; wisdom and power are his. He changes times and seasons; he deposes kings and raises up others."

1 Timothy 2: 1-2 says "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people — for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness."

Journalist Billy Hallowell offers the following as a model for praying for our leaders, adding about the above verse: "Notice that it doesn't say to pray for those in authority with whom we agree. Thus, it's important to offer prayers for all leaders and prospective leaders."

"Lord, I pray for our country and I pray for those in authority. Please guide our senators and representatives — our local, state and national leaders. Lord, I pray for leaders to have Your wisdom in all matters. I pray for our president to have discernment, to have the energy to do this difficult job and to be a person who seeks Your will, not only in his life, but in national matters. God, please heal our land from the chaos and division, and please help every leader to seek Your face. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen."

God calls us to be a people of prayer. No matter who the Lord places in power, let's make praying according to God's instructions/God's heart for them and our nation a regular part of our prayers.
