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Family Homeless Prevention and Assistance Program

Eligibility:

FHPAP provides supportive services and financial assistance, such as rent deposits, rent payments or utility payments, to eligible households that are homeless or at imminent risk of homeless.

- Low income defined as: Household income at or below 200% of federal poverty guidelines according to family size https://aspe.hhs.gov/topics/poverty-economic-mobility/poverty-guidelines
- · Minnesota residents, or household otherwise approved by the funders
- Likely to stabilize with limited assistance Homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness and in need of services and/or financial assistance due to a housing crisis

Minimum requirements prior to acceptance of appointment:

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- Income Verification
- Emergency Assistance documentation

Long-term Homeless Supportive Services Fund

Eligibility:

Long-term homelessness is defined as "lacking a permanent place to live continuously for one year or more or at least four times in the past three years.

The following documents are needed to schedule an appointment:

- Income verification for the previous 30-days
- Social Security numbers of all Households/ Family members
- Dates of Birth of all Households/Family member
- Past due utilities
- Past due rent or mortgage statements

Documentation that homelessness is imminent

LHPA (Local Homeless Prevention Aid)

- Targeting families with children who are eligible for a prekindergarten through grade 12 academic program and are one of the following:
 - → Living in overcrowded conditions in their current housing
 - \rightarrow Paying more than 50 percent of their income for rent
 - → Lacking a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence
- Targeting unaccompanied youth in need of an alternative residential setting
- Connecting families with the social services necessary to maintain the families' stability in their homes, such as housing navigation, legal representation, and family outreach
- One or both of the following:
 - → Providing rental assistance
 - → Providing support and case management services to improve housing stability, such as housing navigation and family outreach
